Effective February 15th, Grand Master Graver issued Edict 4-2021 replacing Edicts 1 and 3 which had restricted Nevada Masonic gatherings. Also on that day, Governor Sisolak issued new Roadmap to Recovery Guidelines for Nevada meetings. Together, Edict 4-2021 and those new guidelines provide an opportunity and pathway to consider opening Amity Lodge for the March 4th Stated Communication.

This is a decision taken very seriously. Our main duty must be to protect our Brothers and to keep the Brethren, their families, friends and our community safe and distant from harms way.

After much thought, advice and counsel, I believe Amity can carefully and safely open for the March 4th Stated Communication. The physical size of our historic building does present a challenge. However, I feel we can safely accommodate the Brothers who regularly attend Amity meetings.

Adherence to the Nevada Guidelines require enforcing 6' social distancing and makes wearing of facial masks mandatory at all times. We will open on the EA Degree at 7:00 pm but will not have a meal or refreshments. Disinfectants and sanitizers will be available. We will check temperatures and blood oxygen levels as appropriate.

To any Brother that does not feel safe attending the March 4th Communication, or has other concerns, please do not feel obligated to be present, it is not necessary. Take care of yourselves, follow your instincts.

Regarding Amity Officers for the 2021 Masonic Year, due to COVID and associated restriction of Masonic gatherings, it was not possible to elect and install Officers during December 2020. Duane G. Laubach, PGM, 88, of Henderson, Nevada passed away on Saturday, October 17, 2020. He was born November 2, 1931. Duane served as Grand Master of the F & A. M. of Nevada in 1983. He was Master of Mt. Moriah Lodge #39 in 1969.

Gordon Franklin Wessell, PGM, 90, was born September 20, 1930 and passed peacefully in his sleep on December 16, 2020. Gordon served as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Nevada in 2001. He was Past Master of Pyramid Lodge #43, a member of Eureka Lodge #16 and Past Master of Research Lodge #1. Gordon served many roles in Nevada Masonry; Scottish and York Rites, Shrine, DeMolay, et al. He received the 33rd Scottish Rite degree in 1997.

George Washington on the Dance Floor

Excerpts from an article written by Phillip G. Smucker's - George Washington on the Dance Floor.

As did their English cousins, Virginians preferred the playful steps of a French minuet set to Handel over, say, a battle in the woods with the natives. Many would have chuckled knowingly at Shakespeare's lines in King Henry VI, when Burgundy says, "I see our wars will turn unto peaceful comic sport when ladies crave to be encountered with. "Most gentlemen of George Washington's era, while aspiring to glory on the battlefield, still preferred love over war, or at least a chance to dance with a lovely lady.

Dancing Teen:

George Washington likely first acquired his dancing skills at his half brother Lawrence's Mount Vernon estate, as well as with the Fairfax family at Belvoir Manor. By the age of 19, it appears that George was dancing regularly.

Mastery of the Minuet:


Dexterity on the dance floor maintained social status and also allowed for proper courtship. Dance represented an elaborate world of nonverbal signs, a system of gestures, starting with curtsy and bow, which derived from an ancient sometimes forgotten European court life. For George Washington and others, dance was refined flirtation -- a means for Virginia's men to express their adoration and interest in ornately attired women - the loveliest of Southern Belles. As a young officer, George Washington gained a reputation as a skillful and polished dancer, sometimes taking the floor at the start of a ball to begin the evening with a minuet. If he hadn't excelled at dance, George Washington might have been known merely as an accomplished dodger of musket balls. Like everything, though, he took his performance on the dance floor serious, once referring warmly to dance as "the gentler conflict."

Dancing Through the American Revolution:


General Washington danced through the evening on several occasions during the American Revolution. After the victory over British forces at Yorktown, General Washington wooed an audience in his old hometown of Fredericksburg, Virginia. Some of the most ornate and fanciful balls a President Washington would attend took place in Philadelphia, starting in 1791, often in the upper floor of the City Tavern. The main dining room and dance floor was magnificent and sprawling for the day with showy fireplaces on either end, ornate wooden mirrors on the walls, and an elaborate chandelier overhead.

Founding Hater, Thomas Jefferson:

At one particular ball in Philadelphia, Thomas Jefferson expressed disdain for the alleged regal behavior of his old friend George Washington. For George Washington, however, such occasional displays of pomp came naturally. Despite Jefferson's conspiratorial view that the new nation might soon slip into authoritarian rule, President Washington never harbored royal aspirations, even in private. For his admired public, his chivalry, sportsmanship and good manners were something to hail and admire. For them, the hero of the Revolution was beyond reproach.
